2. The entry fee is 50p per exhibit. Children under 16 years 20p per exhibit.
3. Every exhibit shall be the property and production of the exhibitor.
4. Competitors are asked to submit no more than 2 entries in any one class.
5. Entry forms, with fees, to be handed to Mrs E Heginbotham (address below) no later than 5 pm on Thursday, 9th August 2018. **You may email** your entries to Louise Burton at louiseh.burton.lb@gmail.com, but these must be received **by 5 pm on Wednesday 8th August 2018**. Email entries must include all the information required on the printed entry form.
6. The Village Hall will be open to exhibitors from 8 am on the day of the show. All exhibits must be staged by 9.45 am.
7. Exhibits should be removed from the hall between 4 pm and 4.15 pm. Exhibits may not be removed before 4 pm.
8. All exhibitors must pay for entry to the show.
Prizes awarded in the classes are:

1st	£1.50
2nd	£1.00
3rd	50p
9. Prize money must be claimed on the day of the show.
10. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to the exhibits and will settle all disputes on any matter arising, not provided for in these rules.
11. Jam jars to be labelled and to have plain or cellophane tops. Chutney and pickle jars to have plain metal screw tops.
12. All photographs to be un-mounted (printed borders are acceptable).
13. Entries in any classes should not have been exhibited in this show in previous years.
14. The rules must be strictly adhered to and entries will only be accepted on these conditions.

ORANGE POLENTA CAKE RECIPE –

250g unsalted butter
250g golden caster sugar
4 large free range eggs
140g polenta
200g plain flour

2tsp baking powder
Zest and juice from 2 oranges (less 100ml juice for the glaze)

For the orange glaze:
100ml orange juice
100ml golden caster sugar

METHOD

1. Heat oven to 160C/140C fan/gas 3.

Grease and line a 23 cm round cake tin with baking parchment. Cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time and mix thoroughly. Once the mixture is combined, add all the dry ingredients, zest and juice after you have measured off 100 ml for the glaze. Transfer the mixture into the tin, spread evenly and cook for 45 mins or until skewer comes out clean. Remove from the oven and turn out onto a wire rack to cool.

2. To make the glaze, put the juice and sugar in a medium saucepan and bring to boil. Let it simmer for 5 mins, then remove from the heat and allow to cool. Drizzle the orange glaze over the top of the cooled cake. Keep in an airtight tin.
