Rules and Regulations

1. The Show is for amateurs only.
2. The entry fee is 50p per exhibit. Children under 16 years 20p per exhibit.
3. Every exhibit shall be the property and production of the exhibitor.
4. Competitors are asked to submit no more than 2 entries in any one class.
5. Entry forms, with fees, to be handed to Mrs E Heginbotham (address below) no later than 5pm on Thursday, 11th August 2016. **You may email** your entries to Lynn McCann at lynn.mccann1@gmail.com, but these must be received **by 5pm on Wednesday 10th August 2016**. Email entries must include all the information required on the printed entry form.
6. The Village Hall will be open to exhibitors from 8am on the day of the Show. All exhibits must be staged by 9.45am.
7. Exhibits should be removed from the Hall between 4pm and 4.15pm. Exhibits may not be removed before 4 pm.
8. All exhibitors must pay for entry to the Show.
Prizes awarded in the classes are:

1st	£1.50
2nd	£1.00
3rd	50p
9. Prize money must be claimed on the day of the Show.
10. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to the exhibits and will settle all disputes, on any matter arising, not provided for in these rules.
11. Jam jars to be labelled and to have plain or cellophane tops. Chutney and pickle jars to have plain screw tops.
12. All photographs to be un-mounted (printed borders are acceptable).
13. Entries in the Handicraft classes should not have been exhibited in this show in previous years.
14. The rules must be strictly adhered to and entries will only be accepted on these conditions.

APPLE AND CINNAMON FRUIT SPONGE RECIPE

7oz Self Raising Flour	3 Eggs (large)
½ tsp Baking Powder	3oz Sultanas
Pinch Salt	1 Large Cooking Apple,
6oz Castor Sugar	peeled, cored and cut into
6oz Soft Margarine (not spread)	small pieces
	1tsp Ground Cinnamon



HAVE ALL THE INGREDIENTS AT ROOM TEMPERATURE. SIEVE FLOUR, BAKING POWDER, CINNAMON AND SALT INTO A BOWL. ADD MARGARINE, SUGAR AND SLIGHTLY BEATEN EGGS AND WITH A WOODEN SPOON OR HAND MIXER COMBINE ALL TOGETHER AND MIX UNTIL SMOOTH. BEAT LIGHTLY, ADD APPLE AND SULTANAS AND THOROUGHLY MIX IN. LINE A 7 1/2" – 8" CAKE TIN. PLACE THE MIXTURE IN THE TIN AND SMOOTH IT LEVEL. OVEN 160C, / GAS MARK 4 FOR 50 MINUTES TO ONE HOUR. TEST WITH A SKEWER.
