- 2. The entry fee is 50p per exhibit. Children under 16 years 20p per exhibit.
- 3. Every exhibit shall be the property and production of the exhibitor.
- Competitors are asked to submit no more than 2 entries in any one class. 4.
- 5. Entry forms, with fees, to be handed to Mrs E Heginbotham (address below) no later than 5pm on Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> August 2017. You may email your entries to Lynn McCann at lynn.mccann1@gmail.com, but these must be received by 5pm on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> August 2017. Email entries must include all the information required on the printed entry form.
- The Village Hall will be open to exhibitors from 8am on the day of the Show. All 6. exhibits must be staged by 9.45am.
- Exhibits should be removed from the Hall between 4pm and 4.15pm. Exhibits may not 7. be removed before 4 pm.
- 8. All exhibitors must pay for entry to the Show. Prizes awarded in the classes are: 1st £1.50

- 9. Prize money must be claimed on the day of the Show.
- 10. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to the exhibits and will settle all disputes, on any matter arising, not provided for in these rules.
- 11. Jam jars to be labelled and to have plain or cellophane tops. Chutney and pickle jars to have plain metal screw tops.
- 12. All photographs to be un-mounted (printed borders are acceptable).
- 13. Entries in the Handicraft classes should not have been exhibited in this show in previous years.
- 14. The rules must be strictly adhered to and entries will only be accepted on these conditions.

# Class 62

### SULTANA, WALNUT AND MALT LOAF RECIPE

**7oz Self Raising Flour 3oz Sultanas** 1beaten egg 2oz Black Treacle 4oz Milk **METHOD** 

1 level tsp bicarbonate of Soda 2oz chopped Walnuts 4oz Malt extract 2oz Golden Syrup



WARM TREACLE, SYRUP AND MALT WITH THE MILK IN A PAN OR MICROWAVE FOR 45 SECONDS ON HIGH. SIFT THE FLOUR AND THE BI-CARBONATE OF SODA TOGETHER AND ADD TO WARM INGREDIENTS WITH THE BEATEN EGG. STIR UNTIL THE MIXTURE IS SMOOTH AND THEN ADD SULTANAS AND NUTS. SPREAD AN EVENLY THIN COATING OF GREASE INSIDE A 2LB LOAF TIN. PUT A DESSERTSPOON OF FLOUR INSIDE THE TIN AND SHAKE IT ABOUT SO THAT THE FLOUR COATS THE GREASE. UPTURN THE TIN AND TAP SHARPLY TO REMOVE THE SURPLUS FLOUR. POUR THE MIXTURE INTO THE TIN. BAKE FOR APPROX  $1-1^{1}/_{4}$  HOURS AT 350°C. CHECK AFTER 50 MINS AND COVER WITH PAPER IF NECESSARY. ALLOW TO REST IN THE TIN FOR 5 MINS. TURN OUT ONTO A COOLING WIRE. BEST LEFT FOR AT LEAST 24 HOURS BEFORE CUTTING.
